It will be so much FUN and such a SPECIAL day for my family and me!






Autism Speaks Walks bring the community together to have fun and raise money that goes towards helping people with autism of all ages with lots of different strengths and abilities!

At the Walk, there will be a big stage where there will be people speaking. There might even be people singing and dancing to music!










There will be a lot of fun games and activities that I can try if I want to. It's okay if I would rather not play though. I can just rest with my family too.

I can even take a photo with them if I want to!

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
There will also be lots of music, clapping and announcements. But I can wear my headphones or go inside a special tent where it will be quiet.

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


Water and snacks like Frito Lay chips, bananas and granola bars will be there if I get hungry or thirsty. I can also bring my own snacks and drinks if I want.
