different places!






My Walk will take place in Philadelphia, all around the outside of a cool stadium called Citizens Bank Park.

There might be a line at the registration tent because lots of people will be there to turn in the donations they raised to help people with autism. Once we get signed in, it's time to have fun!







At the registration table, all of the Walk participants will get a very cool blue pom pom!

The pom pom is a sensoryfriendly way to "clap" and show excitement without the noise!







Some people will get a blue ticket to take to the T-Shirt Tent, to pick up their shirt. Everyone who raises at least \$150 in donations from their friends and family for the **Autism Speaks**Walk will get a ticket for a shirt!

At the Walk there will be a big stage. People will be speaking into a microphone. There might even be a few people who sing and dance! I can sing and dance if I want to!








Before the Walk starts, there will be a mission moment where all of the people will move their pompoms in different ways to celebrate how autism is special to us.

Along the way, there will be lots of people cheering my family and me on as we walk. After we finish walking, the music may be louder, and lots of people will be dancing, and celebrating that we have completed the Walk!















I can go back to the stage area and enjoy the music, take photos, or get a snack or a drink if I want. I can also go home after a fun day at the Autism Speaks Walk!
