My Walk might have 500 people there! That is a LOT of people who are getting together to have fun and help out.








Some of the fun activities include face painting, dancing, coloring, and more!

If the weather is really bad, we can walk inside the Huntington Center.










At the Walk there will be a stage where there will be people speaking. There might even be a few people who sing and dance! I can sing and dance if I want to!

If I get lost, there will be lots of helpers to help me find my family. I will go to the stage or look for people with bright yellow t-shirts and headsets on.






Along the way, there will be people cheering my family and me on as we walk.
