Postsecondary Educational Opportunities Guide

The Postsecondary Educational Opportunities Guide helps adolescents and young adults with autism and their families explore different opportunities and learning environments after leaving high school. Only an estimated 33 percent of youth with autism attend college. It's important to know the options and resources available to young adults. This resource guides young adults through their high school years and the years following graduation.

Community-based Skills Assessment (CSA)

The CSA helps parents and professionals assess the current skill levels and abilities of individuals with autism beginning at age 12 and continuing into adulthood in order to develop a comprehensive transition plan. The CSA is an important tool to assess needs in the area of community-based living, from transportation to financial management to peer relationships and more.

Special Needs Financial Planning Tool Kit

This tool kit provides all of the information you need to develop a plan for your child's financial future. Topics include guardianship, special needs trusts, ABLE accounts and more.
